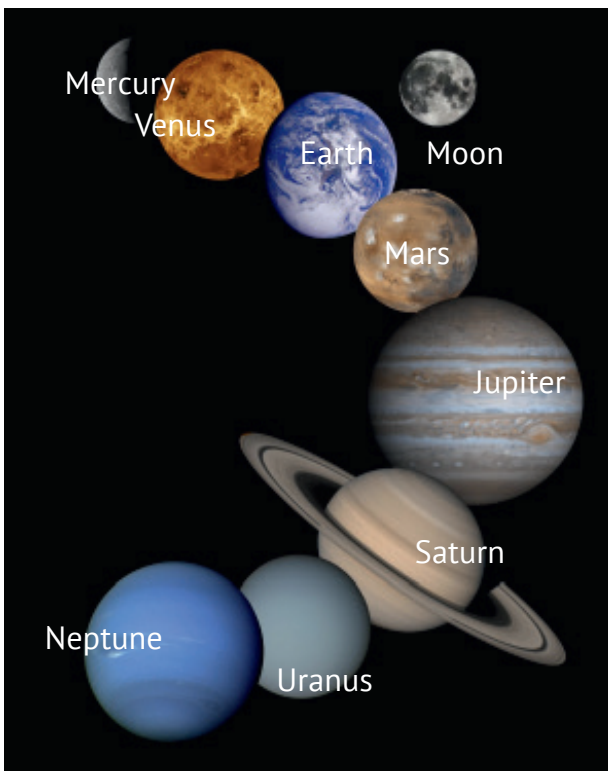

You need at least three drawings in your cartoon. And you also need to add text.

It is up to you to decide whether you want to use a computer program or if you want to make the drawings yourself.



A cartoon contains at least two drawings that are dependent on each other and connected so that they tell a story that continues from one drawing to the next. The text can be speech, sound or thought bubbles. It can also be a short text in a frame that explains what is happening or where it is happening. The cartoon can also be without text so that the drawings alone tell the story.
